



The Monster Insights Plugin within WordPress allows you to add Google Analytics to your website. This will let you monitor visits to your website.

First, you have to have a google account. When signed in, go to Google Analytics, and follow the stages to register your website.





1 Tick this box to enable universal tracking (recommended)


2 Tick this box to get demographic and interestrelated information about your visitors (optional)
